FIRST LESSON Acts 18:1–11

¹After this, Paul left Athens and went to Corinth. ²There he met a Jew named Aquila, a native of Pontus, who had recently come from Italy with his wife Priscilla, because Claudius had ordered all Jews to leave Rome. Paul went to see them, ³and because he was a tentmaker as they were, he stayed and worked with them. ⁴Every Sabbath he reasoned in the synagogue, trying to persuade Jews and Greeks.

⁵When Silas and Timothy came from Macedonia, Paul devoted himself exclusively to preaching, testifying to the Jews that Jesus was the Messiah. ⁶But when they opposed Paul and became abusive, he shook out his clothes in protest and said to them, "Your blood be on your own heads! I am innocent of it. From now on I will go to the Gentiles."

⁷Then Paul left the synagogue and went next door to the house of Titius Justus, a worshiper of God. ⁸Crispus, the synagogue leader, and his entire household believed in the Lord; and many of the Corinthians who heard Paul believed and were baptized.

⁹One night the Lord spoke to Paul in a vision: "Do not be afraid; keep on speaking, do not be silent. ¹⁰For I am with you, and no one is going to attack and harm you, because I have many people in this city." ¹¹So Paul stayed in Corinth for a year and a half, teaching them the word of God.

²⁶A week later his disciples were in the house again, and Thomas was with them. Though the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you!" ²⁷Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here; see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it into my side. Stop doubting and believe."

²⁸Thomas said to him, "My Lord and my God!"

²⁹Then Jesus told him, "Because you have seen me, you have believed; blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed."

³⁰Jesus performed many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not recorded in this book. ³¹But these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name.

About the Cover ~ The painting on the cover is the work of Flemish artist Maerten de Vos (born 1532) whose adult career began shortly after the death Martin Luther. De Vos was known for his historic and Biblical paintings. During the time of the Calvinist uprising in the 1560's in which the Reformed made an iconoclastic attack on church art and icons in the Habsburg Netherlands, many of de Vos' paintings were destroyed. He stopped painting for a long period, and never fully recovered from the shock. For a time, he became Lutheran. But after the Protestants were overpowered by the Roman Catholic armies in Antwerp of the Netherlands, he reverted back to the Roman Catholic Church. One of his most famous paintings is the one featured on the bulletin cover, reminding us of Jesus' appearance to Thomas and the apostles one week after his resurrection. Jesus first words to them were, "Peace to you." That peace of the resurrection is still ours today.
