



Lutheran Military Support Group (LMSG) ~ is a WELS/ELS affiliated ministry that provides Christ-centered support to Military Service Members, Veterans, and their families through the following programs: Spiritual Retreats & Workshops: A four-day Spiritual Retreat for Christian Warriors and their spouses is offered to those who have experienced spiritual wounds and trauma related to their military experience. Similar one-day workshops have been held for Veterans and First Responders in Wisconsin, Arizona, and Washington. Over 240 people have grown spiritually through these small and focused events. Scholarships & **Grants:** Scholarships are available to male and female Veterans pursuing public ministry, along with pastors who serve near military installations. In 2025, nineteen scholarships were awarded. Grants support WELS/ELS Military Service Members when they are in need, to recognize their service at a congregational level, and to support military ministry throughout both synods. Since 2015, over \$380,000 has been awarded to support military ministry through grants and scholarships. Christian Service Members' Handbook: This printed resource includes prayers, Scripture, hymns, Luther's Small Catechism, and devotional resources specific to those in military service. Since 2020, more than 4000 copies have been distributed. LMSG aims to provide spiritual encouragement, mental health support, and Christian community for Military Service Members, Veterans, and their families.
