




²¹ So he got up, took the child and his mother and went to the land of Israel. ²² But when he heard that Archelaus was reigning in Judea in place of his father Herod, he was afraid to go there. About the Cover ~ This painting entitled, "Rest on the Flight into Egypt" by French artist Luc Olivier Merson (1879) which hangs in the Museum of Fine Arts in Boston, depicts Mary, Joseph, and the baby Jesus resting beneath the shadow of the great Sphinx in Egypt. Although the Bible never mentions such an event, the artist reminds us that the Holy Family, as they are sometimes referred to, did indeed go to that historic country, and may have seen the sights which we associate with Egypt even today. In God's plan, he brought Jesus back to the place where the Israelites were once enslaved, but then brought him out again back to the Promised Land on behalf of us all. Jesus' deliverance from his enemies by the hand of God reminds us that God has delivered us from all our enemies through him.
