FIRST LESSON Genesis 8:15-22

2 Corinthians 9:10-15



About the Cover ~ In the Old Testament, before anyone could be declared cleansed of leprosy, the individual had to undergo an examination by the priest, in Leviticus 14. But following the examination, there was a ritual commanded by God. The priest would take two birds, usually doves or pigeons, and kill one of them over a clay pot filled with clean water. He would then take the blood of the dead bird mixed with the water and paint it on the living bird. Upon doing so, he would take the living bird to the open field and release it. Covered in the blood of the dead bird, the living bird would be set free. What a beautiful picture of how the blood of Jesus has cleansed us from sin and allows us to be set free from the power of Satan. What a beautiful ritual which reminds us that we, who once were separated from God, and by all rights should still be, have now been reconciled to him by the blood of Jesus so that we have been set free and are once again a part of God's assembly, and citizens of heaven.
