



About the Cover ~ James J. Tissot created "The Prophecy of the Destruction of the Temple" (sometime between 1886 and 1894) with gouache (a type of water-based paint) on gray wove paper. It resides in the Brooklyn Museum in New York today. In it, Tissot depicts Jesus sitting with a small group of his disciples: Peter, James, Andrew, and John, against the backdrop of the Temple complex and the thick, fortified walls of Jerusalem. They all look distraught as Jesus prophesies the destruction of the temple and its splendor; an event which Jesus described as a sign of the end of times and his final judgment.
